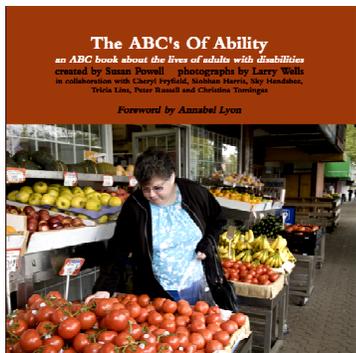


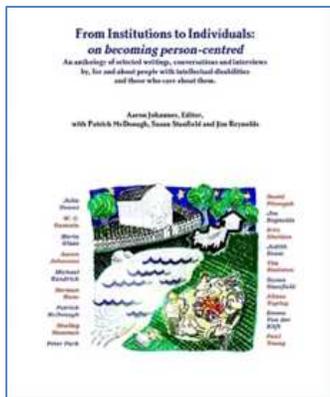

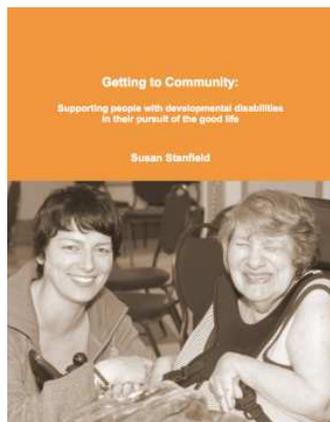
NEW! The ABCs of Ability: An ABC book about the lives of adults with disabilities

NEW! From Institutions to Individuals: On becoming person-centred

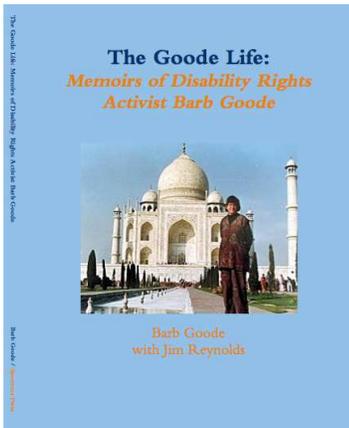

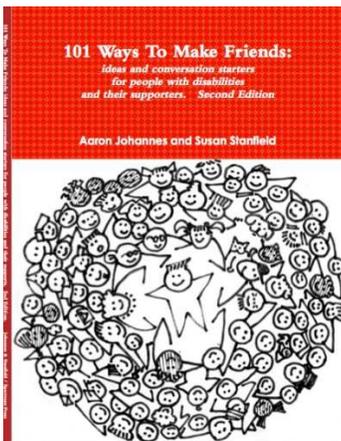

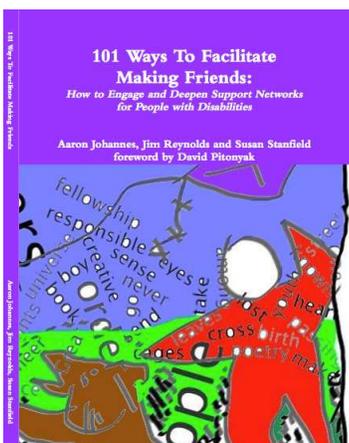
The Goode Life: Memoirs of disability rights activist Barb Goode

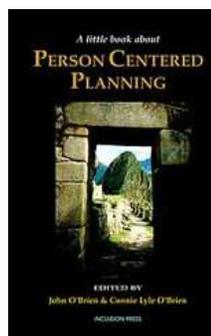
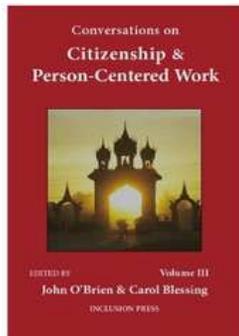
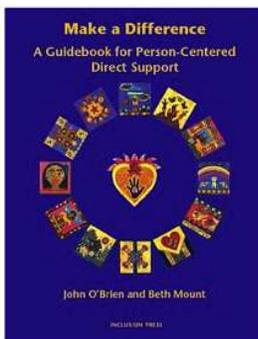
101 Ways to Facilitate Making Friends: How to engage and deepen support networks for people with disabilities

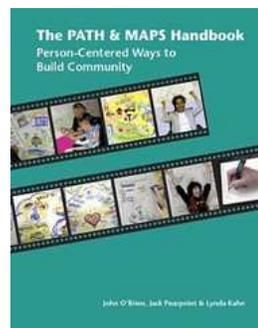
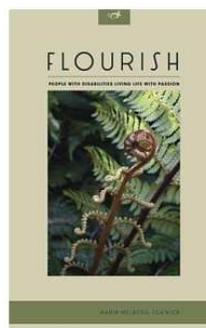
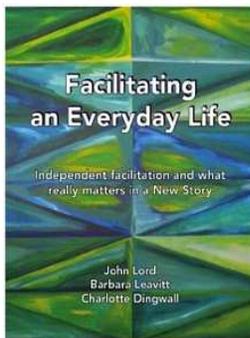


(DVD) And That is How I Got Free of My Isolation
